COMMUNITY STORMWATER ASSESSMENTS, NYC WEST OF HUDSON WATERSHED



Delaware has completed Comprehensive Stormwater Retrofit Infrastructure Inventory Assessment and Planning projects for the Villages of Hunter, Margaretville, and Fleischmanns and the Town of Windham. Delaware is currently involved in the data collection and evaluation phase of a Comprehensive Stormwater Assessment in the Town of Ashland. These projects were funded through Catskill Watershed Corporation (CWC) Grants by New York City. The purpose of these grants is to help municipalities identify and correct stormwater runoff problems which may contribute to degraded water quality in the West of Hudson Watershed.

Delaware conducted detailed assessments of existing stormwater infrastructure in these communities in order to identify and prioritize potential areas of concern and best management practices (BMPs).

Delaware completed the Village of Hunter Stormwater Assessment in 2006 and submitted a CWC Stormwater Retrofit Program Application on behalf of the Village in 2007. CWC awarded the Village 85% of the funding needed to implement the recommended improvements, which included stabilization of drainage swales and design and installation of a 60" culvert in a flood prone area to reduce flooding.
